May He grant you righteous sons and daughters who engage in the Torah and the commandments all their days. May the source of your posterity be blessed. May He arrange your livelihood for you in a permissible way, with contentment and with relief, from beneath His generous hand, and not through the gifts of flesh and blood; a livelihood that will free you to serve HASHEM. And may you be inscribed and sealed for a good, long life, among all the righteous of Israel. Amen.

### Blessing of the Children

The flow of Divine beneficence and blessing which comes with the onset of this sacred day makes it a particularly auspicious time for such blessings. When the parent recites the text of

blessing that the Patriarch Jacob conferred upon his grandchildren, the two sons of Joseph. They grew to be sources of pride to the Patriarch, despite having been raised in Pharaoh's court at a time when there was no Jewish religious life in Egypt except for the intimacy of their own family. Jacob himself indicated that this blessing should be given by Jewish parents to their children throughout history.

ישמר אליהם בשרה ובקה רחל ולאה — *May God make you like Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah.* Unlike that of sons, this blessing is not a

Scriptural quote. However, it is logical to wish Jewish girls that they emulate the Matriarchs who grew up in alien surroundings and surmounted the hardship of infertility and other distress to become the mothers of the nation.

יברכך יהוה — *May HASHEM bless you.* These verses comprise *Bircas Kohanim* [the Priestly Blessings]. The *Kohanim* were designated as the conduit through which God allows His blessing to rest upon Israel. Similarly, parents in their own families serve as agents to bestow God's blessing upon their children.
